


During Advent, the Church First Sunday in Advent does her best to help us get ready for the second coming of Christ.

The Advent Wreath

The Advent Wreath is a great tradition to implement in all homes. Classrooms, and organizations during the Advent Season. There are prayers to accompany the lighting of the Advent Wreath candles. These weekly prayers take only a few minutes but help us focus on dedicating ourselves to Christ during the season of preparation. Obscure in origin it is believed that the Advent Wreath may have had its beginnings in the pagan fire wheel. In Christian symbolism, the wheel or wreath stands for eternity. Its use is especially fitting during Advent, the season of the anticipation of the coming of our Lord. Children love the beauty of the simple traditional ceremony. Lighting candles on an Advent Wreath is a simple way to start a tradition of family worship in the home. Those who participate will cherish the experience all their lives.

The Advent Wreath Ceremony

The ceremony is simple. It starts at the evening meal on the Saturday before the first Sunday in Advent with the blessing of the wreath. The head of the household is the one designated to say the prayers following while various members of the family light the candles. If the group is not a family a leader is selected to say the prayers and others appointed to light the candles.

Blessing of the Wreath

O God, by Whose word all things are sanctified, pour forth Your blessing upon this wreath, and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive from You abundant graces.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The First Week Prayer

Each night of the first week, the first purple candle is lit by the youngest child of the household (or one other selected by the gathering) and is left burning during the meal.

Lord, stir up Your might, we beg You, and come that by Your protection, we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by Your deliverance.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
