

### 2nd Sunday of Lent



How are your Lenten resolutions? By the time week two rolls around, plenty of well-meaning people have skipped, neglected, or outright forgotten their Lenten resolutions at least once. It can be easy to start excusing our Lenten commitments altogether. Last week we saw Jesus driven into the desert. This Sunday, we see Jesus leading his disciples to an equally barren place: he "led them up a high mountain apart by themselves." But what happens there? "And he was transfig-

ured before them and his clothes became dazzling white." Today's Gospel reminds us of the goal. We don't enter into the desert for the sake of suffering, but for the sake of transformation.

Mountain imagery is prevalent throughout Scripture. The sacrifice of Isaac, Moses receiving the 10 Commandments, Elijah's revelation of God as a tiny whispering sound: all these occur on the mountaintop. Mountains are strenuous to hike. To assist the traveler in the assent, trails often involve switchbacks. These lead the traveler back and forth across the mountainside, sometimes appearing as if hardly any ground is gained. Perhaps Peter, James, and John hiked a similar path as Jesus led them up the side of Mount Tabor.

A climb is difficult. A climb in a barren place leaves you thirsty, exhausted, and quite possibly frustrated or discouraged. Yet this is precisely how Jesus leads his closest disciples. Why? Because he has something to reveal to them. Practically speaking, Jesus needed to bring Peter, James and John away from the crowds for this revelation of glory to remain hidden. There are spiritual truths we will encounter only if we pass through difficulty. So let's persevere this Lent! Today's Gospel invites us to trust that, if we persevere in following Jesus, he'll lead us to something beautiful and glorious as well.

#### Transforming the Heart: The Springtime of Repentance

The great time of Lent is upon us! It is the time for more fasting, for more prayer, and for more generous giving. It is the time for a renewal of life in us, and the Springtime of Heaven is revealed in our innermost hearts, when we choose to humble ourselves and so enter into a healthy, lively, and interactive relationship with God. When we repent and so change, then a new life really begins.

In the New Testament, repent means literally a transformative change of heart for us, for you and me. From the heart then the mind is re-oriented to see, and think, and feel in a new and wonderfully different way. Our whole world view can then change, renewed by Christ to see and think and feel with our heart and mind baptized in this newness, this humble-mindedness, this meek way of looking at everything. This is what the Lord said to learn from him. This is truly the Springtime of Lent.

Often we think that great change can only happen later, usually at a more distant time. This is not what Jesus said. It can happen right now. It is a choice. It is the willingness to be open to change, and to acknowledge that we are seeing and thinking and feeling in small and restricted ways, making ourselves the standard of all things instead of God. If we slip into our stream of thoughts the doubt of ourselves as master, as the center of thinking itself, then Jesus Christ has room to enter and effect a great change in us. Giving Christ this room is the beginning of all real and lasting change.

Let us open to him today the gates of repentance, the openness of heart, the pleading call, heart to heart, that we are ready to really begin, ready to be more open, ready to welcome him to be the master and center of our life, and even of this change. He is always standing at the door waiting for us to knock. Let us knock today and begin to really live, so our hearts can become so full of Jesus and Heaven that all the flowers of his spiritual springtime will blossom forth in in us!

sponsorships remain the same as last year. This year again we are offering special opportunities for individuals to help sponsor our Jazz Nite event which will ensure the success of this fundraiser.




